Award for Excellence in Research and Innovation for Driving Global Impact

1. Introduction

Research and innovation are critical in solving global challenges. Our strategic plan is aligned with research and innovation activities. On this regard, the Eastern University, Sri Lanka wants to promote academics for creating, sharing and applying globally–significant research and innovation that is a key deliverable for the economic growth and prosperity of the country.

Therefore, it is important to promote the globally–significant research and innovation in the university. In order to encourage and promote the academics who, carry out the globally–significant research and innovation, the Research Council of the University introduces an "Award for Excellence in Research and Innovation for Driving Global Impact".

All permanent academic members who have achieved a research work in their field and have been at the Eastern University, Sri Lanka for at least five (5) years are eligible to apply to this award. This award will be given annually in the General Convocation of the University.

- 2. **General Guidelines for Applications** for the Excellence Researcher of global significanceare as follows.
 - a) Achievements in research during previous five (5) years, before two (2) years of the awarding year, can be included in the application. (e.g. The research achievement during the period Jan 2014 Dec 2018 will be considered for the 2020 award). The application should be submitted along with the self-assessment done according to the Format given in section 3. All claims should be supported by documentary evidence. No marks shall be given in instances where documentary proof is not submitted.
 - b) Marks will be assigned as follows for publications:
 - i. Single-authored Publication: The author will receive the full 100% of the marks.
 - ii. Publication with Two authors: The first author will receive 60% of the marks and the remaining 40% marks will be assigned to the second author.
 - iii. Publications by more than two authors: The first author will receive 40% of the total marks and the remaining marks will be shared by rest of the authors.

- c) The application should be prepared according to the general guidelines and criteria, and forwarded with the document on self-assessment to the Chairman, Research Council of the University of the Eastern University, Sri Lanka
- d) Application should be forwarded through the proper channel (i.e., through the Head of the Department and Dean of the Faculty)
- e) Applications received after the closing date shall not be entertained.
- f) High-profile Panels of Judges appointed by the Senate of the EUSL, comprising Professors and/or eminent researchers will evaluate the applications and submit their recommendations to the Research Council of the University.
- g) The applicant should score at least 10 points in section 3.1 to qualify for this award. The applicant with highest marks will be considered for this Award.
- h) Final selection of the awarded will be made by the Research Council of the University, based on the recommendations of the Panel of Judges. The decision of the Research Council of the University shall be final.
- i) If an academic received the award in a year, application from the particular academic will be considered again for the same award only after 5 years.
